The Project Coordinator will:

- Manage a project that will protect Human Rights Defenders (HRDs);
- Conduct consultations with various stakeholders including Civil Society Organizations (CSOs), Human Rights Organizations and Networks and other individuals;
- Draft policies and procedures related to the project;
- Liaise with partner organizations and relevant government agencies;
- Attend case conferences and seminars related to the project;
- Be in-charge of over-all implementation, monitoring, and evaluation of the project;
- Write and submit regular reports;
- Coordinate with other entities in the Asia-Pacific Region that relate to the project's objectives;
- Execute other work related tasks that may be assigned by the Section Director

Candidates must;

- Be adept at working with HRDs and their varying advocacies;
- Be willing to learn and go on field and community visits;
- Have excellent skills in writing and communication;
- Be capable of handling responsibilities with minimum supervision and can adapt to new tasks and situations;
- Be a team player with the ability to relate well with people;
- Share the organization's VMG in advancing and promoting the rights of the poor and marginalized sectors;

Preferably, candidates must also

- Have a background in Legal Resource NGO work;
- Be able to start immediately;

Duration of contract is for one year and renewable for another year subject to performance evaluation.
